



Nazareth Area High School Dual Enrollment Criteria for 2009-2010 - Juniors

<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ➤ Students must have earned 14 credits prior to the beginning of their junior year ➤ Students must be up-to-date on the successful completion of their freshmen and sophomore Graduation Project components prior to the beginning of their junior year ➤ Health and Physical Education classes may be taken, but are not reimbursable under the dual enrollment grant; students may take Health and Physical Education classes as concurrent enrollment courses 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ➤ Students may only enroll in elective courses at NCC during their junior year 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ➤ Students must have earned 14 credits prior to the beginning of their junior year ➤ All juniors must minimally enroll in 7 credits per year, including one credit at Nazareth Area High School each semester ➤ The course, credit and the grade earned in the NCC program will be recorded on the transcript. However, the grade will not impact a student's GPA or class rank ➤ No student may enroll in an online NCC course ➤ The management of any course that a student takes at NCC including parental notification of grades, progress, etc., will be the sole responsibility of NCC and not Nazareth Area High School ➤ Students must provide their own transportation to and from NCC ➤ Students who enroll in a NCC course to replace NAHS credit will not be eligible to graduate unless they have successfully attained the minimum number of graduation credits ➤ Health and Physical Education classes may be taken, but are not reimbursable under the dual enrollment grant ➤ All students must successfully complete the course requirements and receive a grade of at least a C or better in order to receive high school elective credit and reimbursement under the dual enrollment grant ➤ As part of the NCC requirements, students will be required to pass the entrance exam/placement test to enroll in any course ➤ The awarding of college credit for any course taken is up to the sole discretion of the college/university to which a student eventually attends
