What are our Elementary Strengths & Challenges?

Strengths

- All buildings are above the state average for percentage of students proficient in ELA, Math, and Science
- The percentage of students proficient or advanced in math at K-6 is increasing in all buildings
- KBES, LNES, and SES exceeded the standard for growth in science
- KBES, LNES, and SES exceeded the standard for growth in ELA
- LNES and NAIS exceeded the standard for growth in Math



Challenges

- Increase the percentage of students with disabilities and economically disadvantaged students who score proficient and advanced or show growth
- Ensure that students at SES and KBES meet or exceed the growth standard in math
- Ensure that students at NAIS meet the growth standard in ELA
- Continue to ensure that students at LNES and NAIS meet or exceed the growth standard in math

How many of our students are completing at least one Rigorous Course of Study (AP courses, dual credit courses, concentrated CTE program)?




How many of our students are competent or Advanced on Industry-Based Assessments (NOCTI/NIMS)?

What are our Secondary Strengths & Challenges?

Strengths

- ★ Student *growth in ELA & Science* at NAMS exceeded the state standard and state average
- ★ Student *growth in ELA, Algebra, & Biology* at NAHS exceeded the state standard and state average; *ELA & Algebra growth was significantly higher* than the state standard and averages

Challenges

- Increase student growth and performance in Math/Algebra at NAMS
- Increase student sub-groups perform Keystone Exams (Economically Disadvantaged, and Students with Special Needs)
- Increase the number of students achieving competent or advanced on industry-based assessments.


Math	Increase the percentage of students that perform proficient or advanced on the PA standardized assessments (PA and Keystone) in math in all tested grade levels on a yearly basis from the baseline scores in the 2021-2022 school year through the 2024-2025 school year.
Technology	Increase the frequency of instructional practices that use technology for project-based learning and authentic learning experiences and assessments as measured by teacher surveys, student artifacts, and classroom observation practices from the baseline data in the 2023-2024 school year through the end of the 2023-2024 school year.
Student supports	Ensure that the intellectual, emotional, physical, and social needs of students are coordinated to support their learning as measured by an increase in positive student perception on surveys of the school experience, classroom observational practices of the classroom environment and discipline referrals data and absenteeism.


