

Sixth Grade Art Students are redefining and applying the elements and principles of design. There are three main art disciplines at the Intermediate School: Painting, Drawing, and Sculpture.

By the end of 6th grade, students will...

1. Painting:

- Demonstrate the proper painting techniques (color mixing, blending, resist) and demonstrate them in projects
- ✓ Demonstrate the proper care in use of the painting materials
- Recognize, expand and apply the fundamental of vocabulary (primary, secondary, warm, cool, tints, shades, texture, contrast)
- Know and use the elements of art and principles of design to produce, review and revise their art work.
- Know how to communicate effectively critical response strategies (analyze, evaluate, form judgments, compare / contrast)

2. Drawing:

- Know and apply drawing techniques (shading, line variation, etc.) and demonstrate them in projects.
- ✓ Using pencils, color pencils, markers, oil pastels, etc. to demonstrate the elements of art and principles of design (line, shape, color, value, texture, balance, contrast, space, proportion and scale).
- Understanding the genres (Pop Art, Modern, Surrealism), art appreciation, styles and time periods of the artists.
- Know how to communicate effectively critical response strategies (analyze, evaluate, form judgments, compare / contrast)

3. Sculpture:

✓ Know and use the elements of art and principles of design to produce, review and revise their work (form, texture, emphasis, space).

- Know how to create forms from a variety of three dimensional materials including clay, plaster, wire, papier mache, etc.
- ✓ Exploring various clay methods: coiling, slab, pinch, additive, subtractive
- ✓ Demonstrate ability to handle and use materials safely and effectively to create a three dimensional work of art.
- ✓ Know how to communicate effectively critical response strategies (analyze, evaluate, form judgments, compare / contrast)
