



TEACHER PROFESSIONAL DEVELOPMENT FRAMEWORK 2024-2025

The Collective Bargaining Agreement (CBA) breaks down professional development into different categories, totaling **45 hours of professional development**.

Category	Number of hours
Professional Development Days (Inservice Days: August 20th, August 21st, November 11th)	18
After School Meetings (ASMs)	9
Faculty Meetings	9
Professional Learning Opportunities (PLO)	9

❖ **Three 6-Hour Professional Development Days (18 Hours)**

Three 6-hour in-service days will be held on **August 20, 2024, August 21, 2024, and November 11, 2024**. All professional staff will be pre-registered in Frontline(MLP) for their sessions. Session information will become available in Frontline(MLP) after **August 8, 2024**.

❖ **Electronic District Faculty Meeting (1 Hour)**

An electronic District faculty meeting will be distributed by **September 3, 2024** not to exceed one hour. All professional staff will be pre-registered in Frontline(MLP).

❖ **Building Faculty Meetings (8 Hours)**

Eight 1-hour faculty meetings will be scheduled by the Building Principal once per month October through May. All professional staff will be pre-registered in Frontline(MLP).

❖ **After-School Meetings (9 Hours)**

Attendance by Professional Staff at the After School Meetings (ASMs) is expected unless other arrangements have been made with the Program Director prior to the meeting date. If a make-up session is required for an After School Meeting, Program Directors will provide professional staff with thirty calendar days' notice. After School Meetings occur outside the contractual day and conclude within 90 minutes of the end of the teacher contracted day, and will not occur on a Friday. All professional staff will be pre-registered in Frontline(MLP).

❖ **District Approved Professional Learning Opportunities (9 Hours)**

According to the CBA, Professional staff are required to obtain 9 hours of Professional Learning Opportunities (PLO). For the 2024-2025 school year, the district will offer a wide variety of sessions for staff on topics ranging from math curriculum to ELA instructional strategies to technology topics. Staff can browse for session topics in Frontline (MLP).

All District Approved Professional Learning Opportunity hours must be completed by **May 1st**.

Professional Staff *must register* for District Approved Professional Learning Opportunities through Frontline(MLP).

Make-up sessions will be offered for District Approved Professional Learning Opportunities *after* the last teacher day of the current school year. During these days, make-up sessions will be designed to run for a minimum of 1.5 hours each and will not exceed two (2) hours.

- Day 1: six (6) hour day
- Day 2: three (3) hour day



LONG TERM SUBSTITUTES

A teacher or professional staff member who joins the district will be required to fulfill professional development requirements based upon the number of days associated with his or her employment. For example, Long Term Substitute teachers (LTS) hired for the first half of the year would be required to participate in professional development activities as they are planned within that given time span. PROFESSIONAL STAFF ON LEAVE

A professional staff member who takes a leave of absence during the school year will be required to fulfill a pro-rated number of professional development hours based upon the number of days associated with his or her leave. ASSOCIATE TEACHERS, LIBRARY ASSOCIATES, NURSE ASSOCIATES, DATA ASSOCIATES, AND AQUATICS ASSOCIATE

The Collective Bargaining Agreement (CBA) for the Support Professionals Association includes four (4) professional development days and twelve (12) hours of professional development during the work year. Professional development in-service days for Associate staff will be held:

- ***August 20, 2024 (6 hours)**
- ***August 21, 2024 (6 hours)**
- **October 14, 2024 (6 hours)**
- **November 11, 2024 (6 hours)**
- ***January 20, 2025 (6 hours)**
- ***February 17, 2025 (6 hours)**

Associate staff who have opted to attend both professional development days on **August 20, 2024, and **August 21, 2024**, are not required to attend the **January 20, 2025**, and **February 17, 2025** professional development days.*
